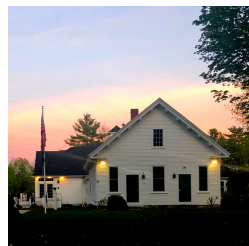

Q&A

Q: When are the plexi guards going to be set up?

A: As you may know, in order to consider moving forward into Phase 2 - Part C of the MEB COVID-19 Phased Library Services Plan, our building must be safe for staff and patrons. I am happy to report that our Lexan shields have arrived at the shop and are pre-scheduled to be installed sometime during the week of August 17th -21st. Allowing for delays, this means we are considering appointment-based browsing in September. The Trustees will be meeting on Monday, August 17th and I will report back with our next steps in that week's e-newsletter.

Q: What is Phase 2- Part C?

A: Currently, Part C includes appointment based/limited access to the building for computer/printer/fax use along with continued curbside service. If things continue to remain stable in regards to COVID-19 in this area, we hope to open to appointment based/limited access to the building for browsing as well.

Q: What will appointment based/limited access to the building look like?

A: Masks will be required to enter the building. Computer use will be limited to 1 person or 1 family unit for a maximum period of 30 minutes. This will allow staff to clean and sanitize the computer area between appointments. (Note: We are working out a solution to computer access for those not able to wear a mask.) Further details for browsing and external computer use are being planned and will be reviewed by the Trustees at their next meeting. I will report back in that week's e-newsletter.

Q: What will programming look like?

A: We will continue to offer virtual programming after a brief hiatus at the end of the Summer Reading Program, during which time we will be cleaning, re-organizing, and preparing for in-person visits. Book groups and other small groups are welcome to contact me to arrange an outdoor meeting space.
